Recovery Resources collaborates with two Cleveland nonprofits

CLEVELAND-November 23, 2010-Recovery Resources has announced new collaborations with two community partners – Joseph’s Home and Cleveland Sight Center.

Recovery Resources delivers outpatient mental health and substance abuse prevention and treatment programs in nine locations and touches 13,000 clients annually in Cuyahoga County.

As part of the new collaborations, Recovery Resources will provide on-site assessments and treatment at Joseph’s Home, a Cleveland nonprofit that provides a safe, supportive environment for homeless men transitioning from local hospitals and other social service agencies following a period of illness or surgery. Residents of Joseph’s Home will have the opportunity to work in individual and group sessions with Recovery Resources representatives on issues such as anger management, grief and substance use.

Additionally, Cleveland Sight Center was awarded a supported employment grant from the Ohio Rehabilitation Services Commission, which enables them to refer individuals in need of mental health and/or substance abuse assessment and treatment to Recovery Resources. The desired outcome of the grant is to empower persons with disabilities to achieve employment and independent living goals.

Recovery Resources offers more than 23 integrated programs and services to meet the diverse needs of various populations, including prevention and education programs; mental health treatment; substance abuse treatment for adolescents and adults; and specialty services for the dually diagnosed, forensic clients, and individuals with gambling disorders.
